NSDAR National Headquarters in Washington, DC, saw a convergence of more than 3,000 DAR members from all over the world at its 116th annual Continental Congress. Official Society meetings commenced Wednesday, June 27, and ended Sunday, July 1. Most attendees, however, arrived in the Nation's Capitol much earlier in the week to attend the many National Committee meetings, forums, and social activities.

Utah's delegation to Continental Congress represented more than half of Utah's chapters. State Regent Pat Fullerton represented Salt Lake Valley Chapter. Mary Alice Brinley was a voting delegate for Princess Timpanogos Chapter. Sego Lily's Chapter Regent and State Corresponding Secretary Cindy Toone attended. Chapter Regent Deloris Niedfeldt and Jacquelyn Coleman, who served as a National Page, represented Wasatch Range Chapter. Uintah Chapter members Marcia McGuire and Cindy Spencer rounded out the Utah group.

The weather cooperated nicely, and was just becoming a tad uncomfortable (warm and humid) toward the end of the week. The National Mall was bustling with visitors. The DAR Library was closed to the public, but brimming with members. Days and evenings were full, busy, but enjoyable. Most of all, it was gratifying to be with others that shared a belief in God, and possessed a sense of pride in and commitment to our Society and the Nation.

C.A.R.

The 36th annual Rocky Mountain Region meeting of the N.S.C.A.R. (National Society Children of the American Revolution) was held in Phoenix, Arizona, on June 18 and 19, 2007. National President Katie Stanley, the National Board, and region presidents presented skits on the National Program and committee contests. Skit characters included Benjamin Franklin, Babe Ruth, Smokey the Bear, Tinkerbell, Buzz Lightyear, Shrek, Ms. DAR, and the Statue of Liberty.

"On October 19, 1781, a British army under General Charles Lord Cornwallis was forced to surrender to General Washington's combined American and French army. Upon hearing of their defeat, British Prime Minister Frederick Lord North is reputed to have said, 'Oh, God, it's all over.' And it was. The victory secured independence for the United States and significantly changed the course of world history." (National Park Service website: www.nps.gov/yonb)

The Junior Ranger Program at Yorktown Battlefield provides an educational experience for children up to 12 years of age to learn about the legacy of Yorktown. With games, arts and crafts, and opportunities to work with the Rangers at the national park, Junior Rangers are given the chance to explore and learn about the battle at Yorktown, Virginia.

This years' National Program is to raise funds to help Yorktown Battlefield put its Junior Ranger Program on the World Wide Web. The money that N.S.C.A.R. raises will help to hire a Web page designer who will create a beneficial program for all to access as well as help to provide the badges that the children earn when they become Junior Rangers. Many children across the United States are unable to visit the park due to financial limitations or family circumstances. However, by accessing a free Web site, all children, no matter their situation, will be able to participate in the legacy of Yorktown Battlefield.

- Did you know that Utah has nine more pending members awaiting approval on their papers in Washington, DC? Great work, Ladies!
- The NSDAR has nearly 168,000 members, awards almost \$1 million a year in scholarships, and supports six DAR schools.
- The four founders of the DAR were formidable women. Two were single, two were widowed. All four were working women who supported either children or extended family. DAR National Member Number 1 was Eugenia Washington (1840-1900). After the death of her mother at age nineteen, Eugenia had to support her disabled father. She moved with him to Washington when she was offered a position with the Post Office Department. She became the first Registrar General, speaking out often regarding her concern for accurate records to ensure their historical value.

This editor would like to issue a formal apology to Honorary State Regent Donna Severson for failing to acknowledge her skills as a dedicated genealogist and historian. Mrs. Severson identified and documented Mrs. Bristol as being the first Vice President General from Utah.

The Early Spring 2007 edition of Utah Daughters's article about Utah's three Vice Presidents General neglected to recognize Mrs. Severson's invaluable contribution to the State Society's history.


Hill Air Force Base has been doing that very thing at a chapel on the museum grounds for the last ten years.
