STANDING RULES

1. Members of the Conference shall be seated before the opening of the session. No one will be seated by the pages during any part of the program.
2. Any business unfinished at the time of recess shall be resumed at the next business session. If business scheduled for one session is finished before the time of adjournment, items scheduled for the next session shall be taken up.
3. Reports to the State Conference: In the absence of a State Officer or Chairman her report will be filed. In the absence of a Chapter Regent, her report may be read by the Chapter Vice Regent or her alternate.
4. No MEMBER shall speak more than twice on the same question on the same day, or longer than 2 MINUTES at a time.
5. When addressing the Chair, a Delegate shall give her name and that of her Chapter. Procedure for addressing the Conference: "Madam State Regent and Daughters" or "Madam State Regent, Daughters and Guests". DURING BUSINESS SESSIONS, she need only address the Chair: "Madam State Regent," (giving name and chapter).
6. Only Delegates may introduce motions. Motions shall be presented in writing and signed by the maker and the seconder and sent immediately to the Recording Secretary.
