Wayne Garrison Blair (Mrs. Donald Shattuck) was elected President General of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution in April 1992. During her three-year term of office, she administers to a Society of approximately 198,000 members in over 3,000 chapters in all 50 States, the District of Columbia, Australia, Canada, France, Mexico and the United Kingdom.

Mrs. Blair has chosen as her Administration Theme, "Continuing the Commitment, Challenging the Future." She is urging chapters and members to reach out into their communities and to promote the program of the National Society——to make a difference——to become involved——to present a positive image. She is challenging chapters to inspire, encourage and assist young women in joining the National Society.

The President General joined the Betty Washington Chapter, Kansas DAR, as a Junior Member in 1963. When the Blairs moved to Ohio in 1969, she joined the Cuyahoga Portage Chapter. She has served that chapter in numerous capacities and is the only past Chapter Regent in its history to be elected Honorary Chapter Regent. She is an Associate Member of Webster Groves Chapter in Missouri and Sara De Soto Chapter in Florida. While serving as State Vice Regent of Ohio, she was also National Chairman of DAR Magazine Advertising Committee. In 1986, following her term as State Regent of Ohio, she was elected Corresponding Secretary General. From 1989 to 1992, she served as First Vice President General and Chairman of Personnel Committee, which supervises 150 employees. During her six years as an Executive Officer, she has helped to increase the operating efficiency of the National Society.

She and her husband are the parents of two children and have two grandchildren. Mr. Blair, a retired Monsanto Company executive, and Mrs. Blair now reside in Sarasota, Florida.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION AND MEDAL RECIPIENTS

George Poulson

Mr. George Poulson will receive the Utah Outstanding Veteran Patient Award. Mr. Poulson was drafted into the Army shortly after his nineteenth birthday on January 8, 1943. He is a native of Utah and a World War II veteran who participated in the second wave of the invasion at Normandy. His platoon surrendered after the battle for Mortran, and they walked to Germany under guard which took three or four weeks. He was interred at Stalag 7A. After liberation, he was taken to Camp Lucky Strike in France. Mr. Poulson went to Camp Adair in Oregon where he was discharged from the military on October 21, 1945.

Kim Morris

The NSDAR Conservation Medal for outstanding educational and media work in conservation will be awarded to Mr. Kim Morris, former Director of Community Relations, Utah Department of Transportation. During Governor Norman Bangerter's term of office, Mr. Morris served as the organizer and detail person for the "Don't Waste Utah" campaign. His efforts have resulted in a substantial decrease in the litter on Utah highways.

James Andrews, Jr.

Mr. James Andrews, Jr., part-time model and actor and full-time recruiting officer for the Utah Air National Guard, is the second recipient of the NSDAR Conservation Medal. Mr. Andrews is the "Road Warrior" in the popular advertising series that is part of the "Don't Waste Utah." campaign. He has given his time to visit Utah schools on the campaign's behalf.
