

A naturalized citizen and veteran of the Korean conflict was interviewed and recorded. A copy of the thirty-minute video was sent to the Library of Congress. SLV helped with a bazaar for women veterans and one junior member trained service dogs for veterans. A total of \$350 cash and \$1800 in clothing, food, games, books, were donated to veterans in 2019.

SLV logged 13,214 Service to America hours, four members took the Members Course and two members the New Horizons course. Two members took GED I and II. Patriot Records indexed totaled 444. Another great year!

She helped Katie put it on the quilting frames with the backing and batting. Katie then hand quilted it. Lorena then finished the sides and made the rod pocket. We entered it to the National contest and titled it "The Last And The First." Thus

emphasizing Harry's monumental vote and our ancestors who were able to vote for the first time. We were thrilled to learn that **our entry won 2nd Place at the National level**.




