The Holidays are fast approaching and what better present could a Daughter receive at this time than a pin to treasure and pass on to their daughters. I have been asked for gift ideas by family members and wanted to share one idea with you. Some creative Daughters have created a ribbon of Commemorative Event Insignia highlighting the Limited 250th Anniversary Series Commemorative pins, which may be worn both on and off of the official ribbon. Let's celebrate!

#1 America 250!

This DAR America 250! pin, the first in a limited 250th Anniversary series commemorating the 250th anniversary of the United States of America. Featuring ornate detailing and vivid enamel, it is the perfect way to honor this historic event.

#2 Boston Massacre 1770-2020

The second in a limited 250th Anniversary series, the DAR Boston Massacre 1770-2020 pin was designed to commemorate the Boston Massacre. The pin's detailed 3D center was inspired by Paul Revere's famous engraving.

#3 Daughters of Liberty

Daughters of Liberty Pin honors our founding mothers and is the third pin in a limited 250th Anniversary series commemorating the 250th anniversary of the United States of America

#4 Sons of Liberty

Sons of Liberty Pin honors our founding fathers and is the fourth pin in a limited 250th Anniversary series commemorating the 250th anniversary of the United States of America

#5 Liberty Tree

The Liberty Tree Pin is the fifth in a limited 250th Anniversary series, commemorating the 250th anniversary of the United States of America. In 1765 at the liberty tree, a famous elm tree on the Boston [Massachusetts] Common, a group of Massachusetts Patriots gathered to protest the Stamp Act, the first act of defiance of the American Revolution.

#6: Celebration of the Bicentennial of Lafayette's Farewell Tour, 1824-1825

This pin commemorates the July 4, 1900 unveiling of the Lafayette statue in Paris. Five million school children in the United State donated to construction of statue; NSDAR funded the statue's pedestal.

#7: 250th Anniversary of the Boston and Edenton Tea Parties

Historic tea parties occurred as a protest against "Taxation without Representation." The teapot depict ed on the pin is from the DAR Museum collection and the ship represents all of the tea parties that occurred between December 16, 1773 and April 1775.

#8: Celebrate the Legacy of Bernardo de Galvez

Spanish Revolutionary Patriot General Bernardo de Gálvez is best remembered for his role in denying the British the ability to encircle the American rebels from the south by pressing British forces in West Florida and for keeping a vital flow of supplies to Patriot troops across the colonies. Gálvez was officially recognized by George Washington and the United States Congress for his aid during the American Revolution. In 2014, Gálvez was posthumously made an honorary citizen of the United States of America.

#9: Rhode Island Gaspee Affair 1772

On the evening of June 9 and into June 10, 1772, a group of courageous Rhode Islander Patriots captured the British crew of the HMS Gaspee, shot the commanding British officer and set fire to the ship, burning her to the waterline. This bold and revolutionary act against the British in protest of tax enforcement occurred 18 months prior to the Boston Tea Party and was an important spark in revolutionary fervor.

Have you ever heard of the Chapter Development and Revitalization Commission, typically abbreviated as the CDRC? So, what exactly are the duties of the Commission? And why is the Commission important to the Utah membership?

The mission of the CDRC is to coordinate the combined membership efforts of multiple National Committees. The Utah CDRC consists of the State Regent, State Registrar, State Organizing Secretary, State CDRC Chair, State Membership Chair, State Lineage Research Chair, State Volunteer Genie Chair, State Junior Membership Chair, DAR Leadership Training Courses State Coordinators and the State VIS Chair.

The Utah Commission is responsible for assisting chapters and their members with both recruitment and retention efforts. The theme for the 2024-2026 Gilliland Administration is *Unite and Inspire: Powering Up Member Engagement*.

To support this theme, the Utah CDRC has developed several programs including the Regent's Roundtable, area Genealogy Workshops, Speaker's Staff, Workshops and a Resource Toolbox. Future programs include VIS training, working with CANVA (marketing tool), Lineage Research insights and developing a strategic plan for our struggling chapters.

- Present a braille flag to a blind or sight-impaired veteran or community member.
- Distribute The Flag Code leaflets and table-sized flags to schools, veterans' homes and hospitals, retirement centers, new citizens at naturalization ceremonies, and at patriotic events such as Memorial Day, Veterans Day, Flag Day, and 4th of July celebrations.
